International Report

As you all know, as members of **Oregon** Association for Family and Community Education we are also members of the Associated Country Women of the World. A portion of the monies that we collect as "Pennies for Friendship" goes to the A.C.W.W. to help fund projects in countries around the world that are helping women to better their lives and feed their families. As your new International Representative I would like to share with you some information on a couple of projects that are currently under way.

In **Hohoe, Ghana,** a group of female farmers are constructing apiaries as part of an **ACWW-**funded project to improve their employment prospects and economic security through teaching bee-keeping skills. A total of 30 apiaries are being constructed altogether and they are already giving instructions on safety measures.

In **Madurai, India** women are taking part in a training course on gender equality, women's rights and leadership skills. Nearly 100 adolescent girls took part in sessions on sexual abuse; discussing what is and is not appropriate and learning how to defend against it.
